A Look Back!

In 1908 a store was built by Jack Diemert at a place about one and one-half miles west of the present site of Pangman on the farm of John Andrich. It was called West Calder. In 1909 construction of the C.P.R. started westward from Weyburn. It reached this area about Christmas 1910. West Calder had to move to the railway. It was the first place of business in the new hamlet which was called Pangman after Peter Pangman, a noted fur trader of the 1780s.

The petition to be incorporated as a village was dated May 1, 1911. Notices were posted by F. Porteous, bank manager, and Pangman was declared a village on May 17, 1911..(excerpt . from the history book "From The Roughbark to the Buttes", published 1981.

4 oz reduced fat cream cheese
1/3 cup plus 2 tsp baking coca, divided
1 ½ cup plus 2 tsp icing sugar divided

- 1. Microwave, melt chocolate chips until smooth.
- 2. In a large bowl, beat cream cheese until fluffy. Beat in 1/3 cup coca plus melted chocolate. Gradually beat in 1 ½ cups icing sugar. (coat hands with icing sugar, roll chocolate mixture into 1 inch balls. Roll in remaining cocoa or icing sugar.
- 3. Refrigerate for at least 1 hour.

COUNCIL NEWS

Welcome to the new column from your village council. We hope we can keep you up to date on this group's activities and decisions. Pangman council met for the first time this new year on January 28th. A busy agenda lay in front of us. First was an update from our Project Manager of the new water treatment plant. The building and its pumps, extensive electrical wiring, heating, and other fixtures are nearly complete as we wait for the arrival of the 17 (eight feet diameter) filtration and storage tanks and the 4 (48 inch) per-ozone tanks in mid February. Like most construction projects in a buoyant economy, work has taken longer than proposed, but Dan has been on each contractor's case to keep them coming for their phase of the job.

The subject of selling the restaurant building, and being able to receive taxes from it rather than have to continue underwriting its maintenance, was once again raised. A letter was read with an offer to purchase the property by a private business person. After discussion, with consideration to the restaurant's present proprietor, Kathy Loucks, and others who may also be interested in this venture, council decided to post a tender to would-be purchasers and advise Mrs Loucks of our intentions.

A letter was hand-delivered to Kathy advising of these plans, and a subsequent meeting was held with Kathy and Tim Loucks on February 1 to hear any concerns.

The subject of filling the position of town serviceman, vacated by Barry Kessler before Christmas, was addressed. The position, including the oversight of water quality,

amongst other duties, has been filled temporarily by Brian Schwindt. The position will be posted this coming weekend, also.

Council also passed a by-law to establish an Emergency Management Organization for Pangman. A committee has been organized to oversee its operations and prepare an emergency plan. The committee will consist of Keith Howse, Barry Kessler, Rod Rowland, Pam Rowland and John Colbow.

Council received the report of progress and authorized continuation of construction of the new daycare centre/kitchen complex adjllacent to the school. 100th Anniversary plans for this summer were reported proceding well. One new resident made a request and updated council on construction plans. Monthly bills were approved for payment.

We finish this report by welcoming all new residents to the area and by thanking all (new and long time) Pangman citizens for your help and encouragement. Also, for those who may be new, or just do not know this, your council currently consists of Mayor Rodney Rowland, Councillor (deputy mayor) Jack Rainey, and Councillor Gary Penner. We normally meet the second Monday of the month. This year our schedule is necessitated off for the first two months. Anyone is welcome to visit council meetings. If you wish to make a presentation, please call ahead to the village/RM office to be booked on the agenda
