Council News

Last week the below notice was sent out to all ratepayers and citizens of Pangman, Norton RM 69 and surrounding communities.

As you are well aware, a beautiful new paved main street in Pangman has replaced the potholes residents and visitors have tolerated for so long. This is due in large part to anonymous donations to this project of \$110,000.00 during the past year. After months of considerations, Council made the decision to do a top quality job that would last, and that we could all be pleased with. It would go from Railway Avenue up to the point where the Province assumes responsibility for the street. The lowest bidder, a past resident of this area, with a good reputation and an interest in doing a quality job, came in at approximately \$234,000.00. He also donated the line painting.

The balance of about \$124,000.00 was proposed to be paid for through a special levy to local ratepayers, rather than a long term loan and a higher mill rate. After much deliberation and listening to residents, council has felt to postpone the proposed levy to ratepayers for this year. Instead, we are inviting individuals and businesses, with a heart for this community, to make voluntary donations for which a 100% tax deductible receipt will be given. Any amount not covered by the end of the year can then be paid through a levy, if needed.

Thank you for your thoughtful consideration and patience as we try to administer a difficult, but exciting opportunity, and continue to make this a better community.

Pangman School Under Review

As you may know Pangman has been advised that the school is under Review.

At a special meeting on September 26, 2011, the South East Cornerstone Public School Division passed a motion of intent to review the potential discontinuance of one or more grades

and/or potential closure of Pangman School in accordance with the review criteria contained in Board Policy 14 sections 1 and 2 that were adopted by Board motion #11-89 dated June 16, 2011.

Under the current legislation a School Review Committee must be established. This committee will be comprised of up to four members of the current School Community Council, two members of the town/village council and two representatives of the council of municipalities in the school division. It will be this committee's responsibility to:

- a) Acquaint itself with the Board of Education's school review process including the criteria being used for the school review and the data that will be used to evaluate the school against the review criteria;
- b) Describe the impact that all potential outcomes of the school review process will have on the students and the broader community;
- c) Share the information provided by the Board of Education with the community and ask for written feedback from the community;
- d) Share the written feedback received from the community and the school review committee's recommendations with the Board of Education.

The provisions regarding a motion of intent to review a school and the process are laid out very clearly in The Education Act, 1995 and in Board Policy 14. These documents can be found at www.cornerstonesd.ca on the front page under the heading of School Review Process.
