HomeLogic Introduced

Pangman School is very pleased to announce HomeLogic will be open parents/guardians and students as of November 2012. HomeLogic provides the opportunity for parents/quardians, as well as students, to stav up-to-date with student achievement through a secure web-based portal. Achievement marks for all subjects in Grades 10 - 12, and math and other assorted subjects in Grades 1 - 9 will be available in addition to student attendance. schedules. unofficial transcripts, student assignments, and other class and school events posted by the classroom teacher. A single signon for parents and guardians provides access for multiple children in a family, and an automated email notification alert feature improves communication between home and school.

South East Cornerstone believes that the reporting of assessment is vital to the critical partnership between home and school. Communication between teachers and parents and guardians concerning student progress must always remain open and be an ongoing process. While periodic report cards are one way of transmitting information about student progress to parents and guardians, we believe that more frequent sharing of information strengthens the essential association between home and school.

Pangman School Pilots Breakfast Club

The School Community Council and Pangman School are piloting a Breakfast Club for its students. Why should a school or a community group invest time and resources to offer a meal that has traditionally been part of the family sphere? Simply, we believe that the education performance of our students can be enhanced by implementing the program.

School breakfast programs are not intended as a replacement for morning family time. They can however, become a great option for students. For instance, school children may experience one or more of the following situations:

- Students do not take the time or receive food at home;
- Students leave home too early for breakfast because of the long travel time to get to school;
- Students can find schoolwork difficult and can benefit from interactions with school staff in an informal environment:
- Students need support interacting with their peers and those in other age groups;
- Students need an opportunity to learn a new skill or take on a role of responsibility (if the breakfast program provides such additional opportunities).

A simple breakfast will be offered to our students each school day from 8:30-9:00 AM. Toast, cereal and fruit will be made available. Breakfast Club will use school staff and community volunteers to socialize and supervise the students during this time. A review of the need, use and cost will be undertaken in January by the School Community Council to determine if the Breakfast Club is a program that will operate for the rest of the school year.

EARLY DEVELOPMENT INSTRUMENT (EDI)

The Early Development Instrument is given to Kindergarten students and measures their readiness for school. It consists of five domains: Physical Health and Well-being, Social Competence, Emotional Maturity, Language and Cognitive Development, and Communication Skills and General Development. Here are some activities in each of the five domains to improve your child's readiness for Kindergarten.

Physical Health and Well-Being

- Walk up and down stairs using alternate feet.
- Throw, catch and kick a ball.
- Balance on one foot.
- Walk like different animals.
- Draw stick people. Set up an art area with low table, paper and lots of chunky crayons.
- Hold a pencil correctly.
- Cut with scissors.

Social Competence and Emotional Maturity

- Ask your child to help with an everyday task.
- Put away their toys.
- Follow one and two-step directions.
- Play with other children.
- Show empathy for others by helping a friend when he is hurt.
- Comfort your child when they are afraid and let them know you are there for them.
- Allow your child to dress themselves independently.

Language and Cognitive Development and Communication Skills and General Knowledge

- Provide opportunities for them to be around other children. Talk about what is happening throughout the day using the words now, soon and later.
- Allow your child to turn the page when you read together. Have books available for them to access.
- During play, talk about what they are doing and ask questions to extend the conversation.
- Go on a nature walk or to a museum and talk about what they are seeing.
