## Political Studies 1\&2



Miss Quigley's students have been analyzing how decisions are made within the local community (curriculum outcome PA2.1) and assessing and practicing various approaches to conflicting interests within the community (curriculum outcome PA2.2). The students wrote and presented speeches to their classmates prior to electing a mayor and councillors by secret ballot. Each student wrote a letter to the council detailing a possible community issue, detailing why it was a concern and suggesting possible solutions. During the mock village council meeting pictured above, a villager presented her letter to the mayor and village councilors. The mock village council made motions and action plans for the issues.


On April 8, Pangman School celebrated the Red Cross Day of Pink. During the student assembly the grades 3-5 students performed skits demonstrating the anti-bullying message.

Easter Basket Weaving


K-2 students used paper weaving techniques to create their own patterned Easter baskets. They caught on quickly to how to weave the paper strips tightly to create their patterned basket art project.

How many cube blocks does it take to cover a Base 10 one hundred block?


Our grade one students have been exploring the use of non-standard units of measurement to measure the area of objects. They had to work carefully to make sure that they were not overlapping or leaving gaps that would lead to an inaccurate measurement. They discovered that selecting an appropriate nonstandard unit to measure the area is critical to obtaining an accurate measurement that can be used to compare the area of multiple objects.
