Did you know?
Chronic absenteeism is not just a high school problem. One in 10 kindergarten and 1st grade students is chronically absent (missing 2 or more days per month or 20 days in a school year).

One study found that a student chronically absent any year between 8th grade and 12th grade was 7.4 times
 more likely to drop out of school.
