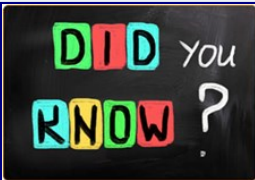
Art projects with unused items.

K-3 Downtown Library Visit

On March 10 the Kindergarten to Grade 3 students walked to the public library for their first story and activity time with the new librarian. The students get to participate in this visit once each month.



To finish up our unit on ecosystems, the 7, 8, 9 class was investigating the school's impact on the environment. In this case we went through a day's worth of garbage in the school. We found that a large majority of garbage the school produces is through food waste and plastics.



.....that SECPD supports student's graduation through Alternate Pathways Credits. These elective credits allow for students to explore careers and topics outside of the Core Curriculum and help them to gain recognition for work and interests outside of the classroom. There are four types of alternate pathways credits:

Special Project Credits represent a unique learning experience for students. Special projects are often tied to a student's specific area of interest including, but not limited to, community service, research, technology, performing arts, athletics and entrepreneurship. Students may earn up to 3 credits (10, 20, 30) during their high school years.

Career and Workplace Credits (CWEX) aim to assist students in understanding themselves. Through a CWEX credit students experience work and have the ability to identify unique skills, make future occupational choices, and experience various work roles. Students may take up to 4 CWEX Credits (CWEX10, 20, 30A, 30B).

Apprenticeship Credits give students the opportunity to experience trade specific work. Under the supervision of a Journey person students may earn up to 4 credits (Apprenticeship 20A, 20B, 30A, 30B). These credits can be used to meet the PAA requirements for graduation or may be included as electives.

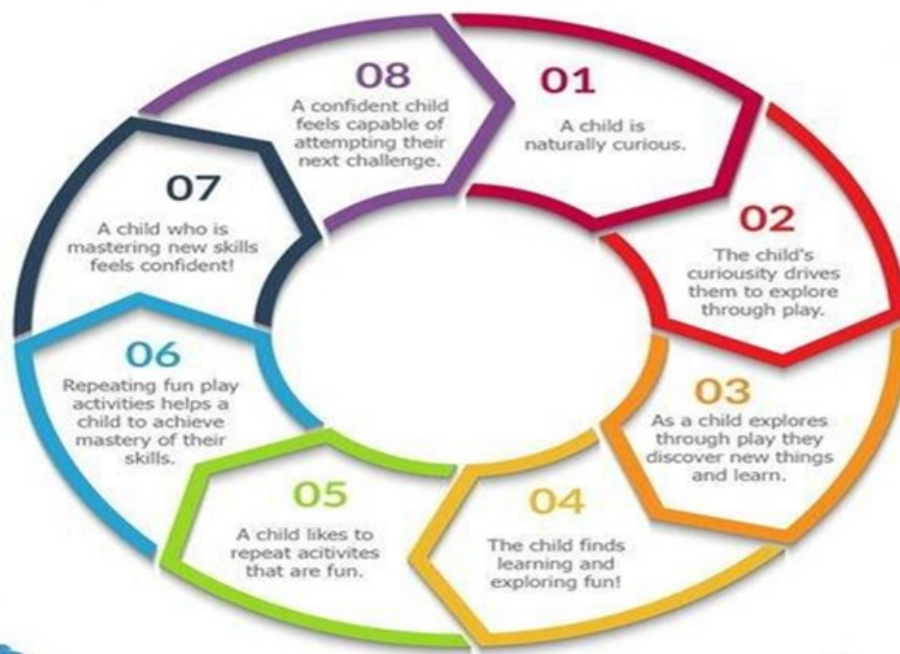
Dual Credit Courses are designed for students to experience post-secondary institution coursework while receiving Graduation requirement High School Credits. Current partnerships exist with Saskatchewan Polytechnic, University of Regina and University of Saskatoon.
