
Bottle Drive

Grades 1-2

Ozobots: Who doesn't love robots?! In this activity students will have the chance to work with small robots. They will design a track with simple codes that the robot will read and respond to.

Kindergarten Orientation

On May 31 from 9:15 – 11:00, the students starting Kindergarten in the fall are invited to attend a School Orientation Session with their parents. The students will move through activity stations with the current K-2 students. They will have an opportunity to become familiar with the classroom, school and school staff. Field Trip!



The K-3 class will travel to Weyburn on May 18 for a field trip. They will visit the radio station in the morning for a tour, have lunch and attend a clay workshop at Signal Hill in the afternoon. Students will learn simple techniques that make working with clay easy and fun. Grey clay will be used for all projects. Students will have the opportunity to paint their project, in class, using bright under glaze colours. This will be done during the session. After the projects have dried, we will apply clear glaze, then fire them in the kiln. Projects will be ready to take home at a later date. The students will return to school in time for the buses.

Live Different Presentation

The Grades 7-12 students travelled to Ogema to participate in a presentation about the importance of empathy. The presentation consisted of various motivational speakers and how they overcame their challenging past to make the world a better place.



Four Colour Theorem

The 7, 8, 9 class investigated the 4 colour theorem. The theory states that one can colour any map using at most 4 colours and never have the same colour touch itself. As a final project we coloured a map of the world.

Measuring Volume in Cubic Metres

Experimenting with Light

The grade 4-6 class has been learning about light in science this month. Here are some of the experiments the students did to learn about why lenses are useful, how rainbows and prisms work, how humans use colour in life, and how nature can change the paths of light.



Composting

Turn old leaves, dry grass and vegetable peelings into healthy soil



Composting is a great way to:

- ✓ Teach children to reduce landfill waste
- ✓ Reduce household and school waste
- ✓ Turn waste into healthy soil for school, home or community gardens
- ✓ Teach a variety of school subjects

Put in

These things can be put in compost bins

- ✓ Egg Shells
- ✓ Vegetable and fruit scraps
- ✓ Tea bags and coffee grounds
- ✓ Paper towels
- ✓ Grass clippings
- ✓ Leaves and plant trimmings

Keep out

These things should NOT go in compost bins

- ✗ Meat, chicken or fish or their drippings
- ✗ Bones
- ✗ Weeds
- ✗ Cooked food, bread and other baked items
- ✗ Milk or other dairy products
- ✗ Oil or grease

Composting in 5 simple steps:

1. Make or buy a compost bin.
2. Add compostable items in layers of moist and dry items. Moist items are like vegetables scraps and tea bags. Dry items things like dry leaves.
3. Keep the compost moist but not soaking. Add water or dry material as needed.
4. Turn the compost with a pitch fork to add air.
5. Wait until it turns to soil and add to the garden! (Usually takes about 6 months).
