### What is kindergarten readiness?

You know your child best. Think about what your child is like when playing with others and when alone in their room. Then ask yourself the following:

- 1) Can my child listen to instructions and then follow them? Children need these skills to function in class, to keep up with the teacher and with their peers.
- 2) Can my child put on their coat and go to the bathroom by himself? Children need to be somewhat self-sufficient by school age.
- 3) Can my child use scissors, hold a crayon or a pencil or pick up small objects or manipulate pieces to complete a puzzle? Children will need these fine motor skills.
- 4) Does my child show an interest in books? Do they try to "read" a book by telling a story based on the pictures? This is a sign that their language development is on a par with other kindergartners.
- 5) Is my child curious and receptive to learning new things? If a child's curiosity is stronger than their fear of the unfamiliar, they will do well in school.
- 6) Does my child get along well with other kids? Does my child share and know how to take turns? Your child will be interacting with other children all day, so your child's social skills are particularly important for success in school.
- 7) Can my child work together with others as part of a group? The ability to put their needs second, to compromise and join in a consensus with other children, is also part of emotional competence.

If you answered "yes" to most of these questions and "sometimes" to the rest, your child is ready for kindergarten.

### **Travel Fun**



#### South East Cornerstone Early Learning

It's no secret that preschoolers have a ton of energy. A preschooler seated in a car seat for longer than 20 minutes at a SOUTH EAST time is usually long enough to make you rethink road trips altogether. So how do you keep a young child's attention? CORNERSTONE Try interactive, short, easy and fast-paced car games — and change it up frequently!

#### Car games and activities for toddlers, preschoolers and younger children

Draw it: Call out letters, numbers, animals and places, but instead of dealing with messy markers, use a Magna Doodle.

- **Nursery rhymes and songs:** Brush up on your nursery rhymes and toddler songs! Little ones love to sing their favorite tunes from preschool and playgroups.
- **I Spy:** Before you embark on your road trip, strategically place large, colorful items around your car and within your child's view from his or her car seat.

**Puzzles:** Provide wooden puzzles for your little one. Storing them in zip lock bags helps to keep all the pieces together. Be sure the pieces are large enough to not be a choking hazard.

#### Car games and activities for older children

Older children enjoy learning new things, being active and being creative — even while in the car.

- I Spy: Challenge your kids with a game of I Spy while on the move.
- **Alphabet game:** Encourage your kids to explore their surroundings to find the letters of the alphabet on road signs, license plates and other signage visible from the road.
- **License plates:** Make a list of the provinces of Canada and silently check off each one as you see a matching license plate. Then set a number and the first person to reach that number wins.
- Name that tune: Make a playlist of your family's favorite songs and ask your kids to guess the name of the song and the artist.
- **Finish the song:** After guessing the name of the song and the artist's name, stop the music to see if your kids can finish the rest of the song on their own.
- Books and magazines: Be sure to bring a good book, comics and/or child friendly magazines.

**Word and number books:** Word search, crossword puzzles and Sudoku books can occupy children for kilometres. So be sure to bring a variety.

Make a travel kit.

Here are some ideas of budget-friendly items to add to your kit:

- Allow your child to help choose what kind of items go into the tote bag. However, be sure that your child does not decide everything, because the element of surprise will keep your child from getting bored.
- Bring snacks for on the trip. Choose healthy snacks, low in sugar, which are easy to pack such as: fresh fruit and vegetables, cheese, multigrain crackers, nuts and pretzels.
- Include Post-it sticky notes, stencils and stickers in your child's tote. Your child will love writing messages and drawing on them, and then he or she can stick them on the windows and create an art display.
- Don't forget the crayons and pencils.
- Wrap all new items in the tote bag in recycled gift wrap or construction paper. Give your child a new surprise every so often to keep them from getting bored.







On May 31, the three students starting Kindergarten in the fall visited the K-3 classroom. They travelled around six stations to meet their future classmates, school staff and school division support staff. We are excited to welcome Leila, Keefer and Alissa to our class.





The grades one and two students experimented with Oobleck after reading about it in the Liquids and Solids section of the grade two reader. They were fascinated that at times it behaved like a liquid and other times like a solid without any change in appearance. For example, it would drip like a liquid but when pushed down on in the pan it felt like a solid.











The 10-12 class went on a field trip to Fort Walsh in the Grassland National Park. While there the students experienced the historically accurate Métis fur trade cabins and Fort Walsh as it was in the 1870s. After a full day at Fort Walsh the class spent the night at the Historic Reesor Ranch, a ranch that has been established in the Cypress Hills for over 100 years.

You can find this link on the home page of all school websites in the Useful Links section.

Your eLibrary is open 24-7-365. No special app is required and any web-enabled device – PC, Mac, smartphone, iPad, & other mobile devices - will open the library doors. Download a title to your device for offline reading and the book will check itself back in after two weeks, or read online and check it back in early when you are done. A simple login (user ID "qwerty" with password "123") makes it easy for younger students to access the library and has an automatic check in after 2 hours – great for classroom reading, listening to audiobooks, or for family reading time at home. All titles are designated as Juvenile, Young Adult, or Adult to ensure appropriate reading material for all.

Most titles are single user – only one person can check out the book at a time, just like a physical book in your school library. You can also recommend titles for purchase when browsing the stacks of the eLibrary.
