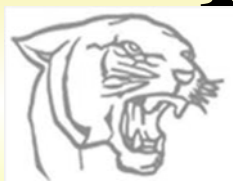

Grades 10-12. For her constant positive attitude and outstanding efforts in Environmental Science 20 and Foundations Math 20.

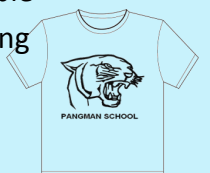
SRC

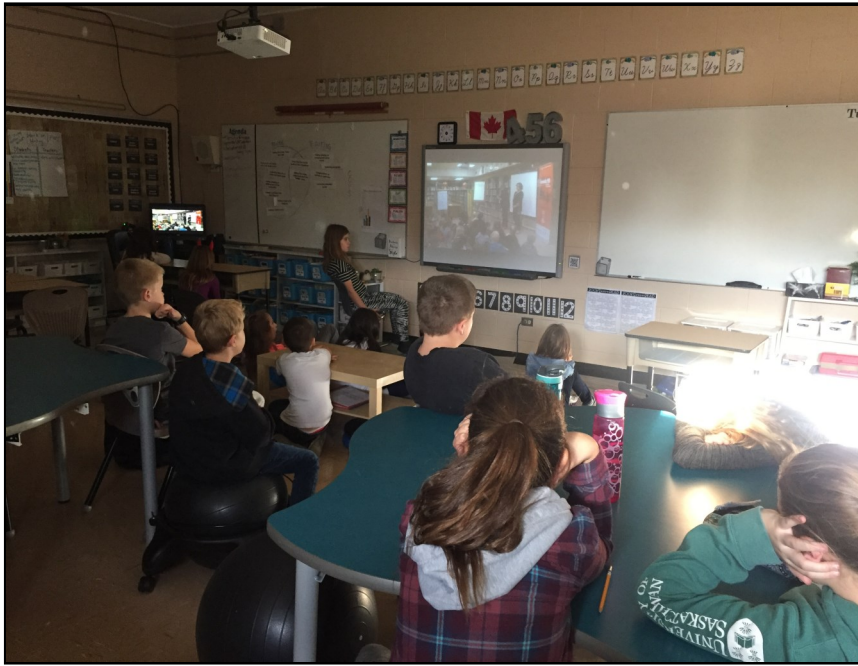
School Clothing

A big thank you all helpers for volunteering their time to make the Book Fair a success.

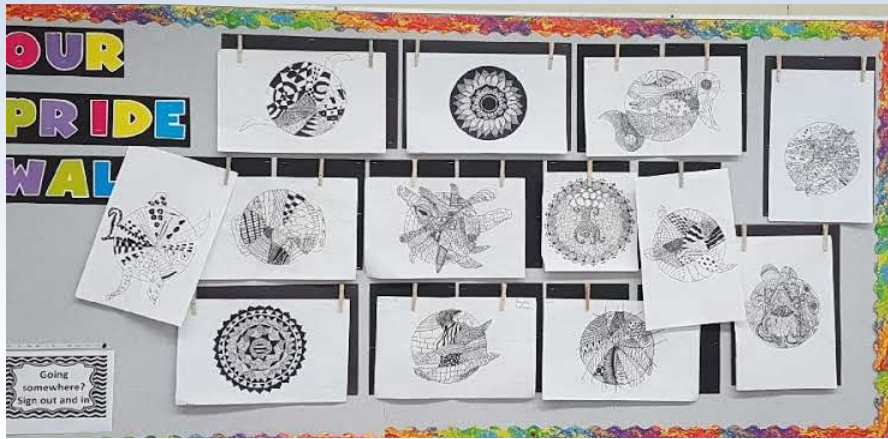
One student from each grade won a poster!

Happenings in the 7/8/9 Classroom

The 7/8/9 Classroom is a busy place. This month, the students participated in a Live Arts web seminar through Live Arts Saskatchewan. We focused on the drama technique of storyweaving, which involves creating stories with movement, song, sounds, and words. Through a live broadcast, the students worked with First Nations artists Yvette Nolan and Michelle Olson. Students will be using this technique to create "Place Stories." 7/8/9 parents, watch SeeSaw in November for these creations!

Also in Art, the 7/8/9 students have been looking at the Art Nouveau movement. We have been focusing on various *elements* of art, and the students created texture pieces in the Art Nouveau style.
