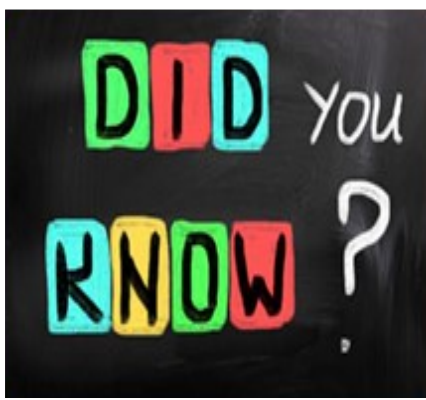

... that high school students in South East Cornerstone Public School Division have the opportunity to become 5th Class Power Engineers through the Power Engineering program offered in conjunction with SaskPower and Prairie South Schools.

Students scattered throughout Southeast Cornerstone School Division have or are currently completing two high school credits: Introduction to Power Engineering 20L and 30L and are preparing to challenge industry recognized 5th Class Power Engineering Certification in June. The past two years have seen students from Weyburn, Yellow Grass, Stoughton, Gladmar, Carnduff, Moosomin, Radville, Rocanville, Lampman, Oxbow, and Estevan participate in this career exploration experience.



The blended learning delivery model allows students the opportunity to explore Power Engineering pathways along with other trades regardless of geographical location. Each course consists of 50-60 hours online theory and 50 hours work-study at a SaskPower plant and mobile steam lab. 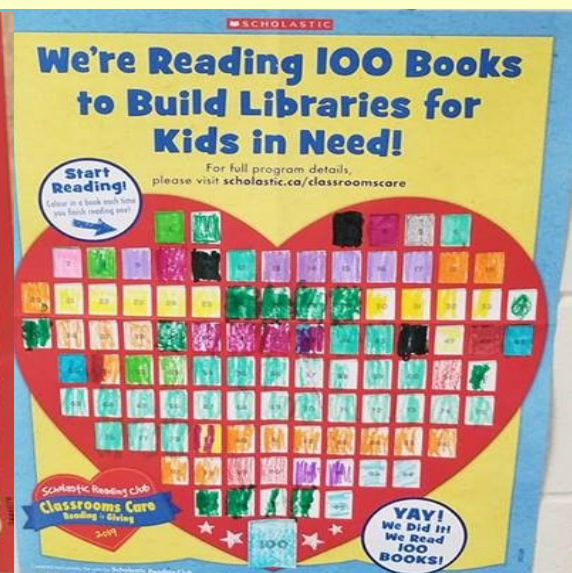

Creating a Big Life Board is a fun, positive activity! It helps children practice goal-setting, discover new interests, and boost their self-esteem.

- Step 1** **Discuss the Purpose of the Big Life Board**
Take some time to discuss goals, dreams, and interests. Discuss the topics of grit and perseverance and how they can help your child achieve their dreams.
- Step 2** **Find Your Inspiration**
Search for "dream board" or "vision board" on Google and Pinterest to find examples.
- Step 3** **Plan Your Board**
Do some basic sketching on a piece of paper first so that you can see the final layout.
- Step 4** **Create Your Board**
You will need your building blocks: images, quotes, colored paper, ribbons, cardboard letters, graphics, etc. Grab tools like scissors, glue, staples, markers, colored pencils.
- Step 5** **Display and Keep It Alive**
Display your board someplace where it can become a powerful reminder for children and adults.
