K-2: For being kind, considerate, and helpful. She is always cleaning up the classroom and helping those who need it. Keep up the great work!





BUS SERVICE CANCELLATION - INCLEMENT WEATHER

Background: The transportation of students to school is a responsibility shared by parents and the Division both recognizing that the health, the safety and the welfare of the students is of the ultimate importance.

The Division recognizes that from time to time, severe weather conditions or poor road conditions may negatively impact on student safety and occasionally bus transportation may have to be cancelled. Further, given the large geographic area encompassed by the Division, it is recognized that the severity of weather or road conditions can vary from one region to the next.

As a result, the Division understands that severe weather can result in bus schedules being changed or routes cancelled to respond to severe conditions and that those decisions must be able to respond to local variations in conditions. The Division also understands that parents may choose to keep students off the bus or drive them to school regardless of the status of bus service.

Parents are responsible to exercise additional diligence on days of extreme conditions and are to be certain of bus status before sending students to designated bus pickups. Parents are advised to check public information sources and the Division's website for information on bus status.

Procedures

- 1. Principals will ensure that billet information is supplied for each of its students that live outside of the urban centre where the school is located.
- 2. Principals will develop procedures to contact billets and/or ensure student safety in the event of route cancellations after students are at school.
- 3. Factors that impact the decision for a cancellation of bus service include, but are not limited to:
- 1.1 Severe cold (-40° ambient temperature or -45° or greater windchill).
- 1.2 Consideration of the weather forecast for the day.
- 1.3 Severely limited visibility, blizzard or "white out conditions".
- 1.4 Unsafe or extremely adverse road conditions.

No single factor automatically requires the cancellation of routes.

(Conditions reported on www.theweathernetwork.com at 6:30a.m. will be the criteria used throughout the Division)

- 4. When the decision to cancel routes is made, the Manager of Facilities and Transportation or designate shall:
- 4.1 Provide information on the cancellation to local radio stations and schools.
- 4.2 Post the information on the Division website and social media.
- 5. If a bus route is cancelled in the morning due to severe weather conditions, it will schedule to operate in the afternoon. If the route is cancelled for the afternoon, bus drivers will notify parents and school. Cancellation of afternoon routes shall occur no later than 1:00 p.m.
- 6. If the decision to cancel is made after students are in school, students transported to school by bus shall be required to stay at school until they are taken home or other appropriate arrangements for their care have been made.
- 7. Authority to cancel bus routes is delegated as described in this procedure.
- 8. Urban Only Bus Routes
- 8.1 Urban bussing will normally occur even if rural pickups are cancelled.
- 8.2 The Manager may cancel urban only bus routes. When the Manager makes a decision to cancel urban routes in an urban centre, all urban routes in that urban centre are cancelled.
- 8.3 During severe weather conditions, children are to be accompanied to the bus stop or have very clear instructions on what to do if the bus does not arrive. Children are never to be left at the stop without an alternative arrangement in the event of an emergency.
- 8.4 The Manager's decision to cancel urban routes will, where possible, be made in cooperation with the Transportation department of other Divisions in the same urban centre.
- 8.5 When the Manager makes a decision to cancel urban routes, the Manager or designate shall inform the affected bus drivers and schools.
- 8.6 Principals may arrange for additional communication with parents in the case of Urban Route Cancellation.
- 9. Rural Bus Routes
- 9.1 A driver may cancel his/her bus route according to the criteria in this procedure and guidance from the Manager. When a driver makes a decision to cancel the driver's bus route, the driver will, one half hour (½ hour) prior to first pick up, contact the parent or guardian of each child who would ordinarily ride on the bus, the principals of school (s) affected by the cancellation and the Manager or designate.
- 9.2 The Manager may cancel any one route, combination of routes or all routes. The Manager will notify affected drivers of the cancellation.



There's Snow Better Time to Read




In the new year, our elementary students will be participating in the **One School, One Book** TM Program.

SCHOOL POLICY FOR ELEMENTARY STUDENTS-KINDERGARTEN TO GRADE 9

Parent / Guardian Entering School

 We encourage frequent and open access to the school. For the purpose of child safety, visitors are to use the Visitor Entrance only and are required to notify the office that they are on school grounds. All other entrances are locked at 9:00 a.m. Please report to the office when visiting the school.

Communication/Organization

2. We encourage parents /guardians to use Seesaw. It is an effective method of student organization and student/ parent / teacher communication.

3 Student Absence

- In Grades Kindergarten to grade nine attendance is taken at 8:55 AM. and 1:00 PM.
- Messages from parents / guardians are required prior to a planned student absence. Messages maybe sent through Seesaw.
- Students require parents to send a message or phone call on any occasion that they need to leave the school
 grounds at a time other than dismissal time. Bus students wishing to leave the school during the lunch hour
 must have a message registered with their homeroom teacher by 9:00 a.m. No late texts or phone calls will
 be accepted unless an unexpected reason arises or an emergency. Please contact the office in this situation.
- Parents / guardians need to check in at the office prior to going into school / classroom areas if they are required to pick up their child/children at any other than dismissal time.
- Parents / guardians are required to notify the school office on the morning of an unexpected absence. If the school does not receive prior notice, you will receive a phone call from the school office to confirm your child's absence.

4. Student Arrival at School - Noon Hour-Departure

- Town and bus students are to arrive at the school no earlier than 8:45 A.M. (before school) and 12:40 P.M. (noon hour). Students are encouraged to play and participate in outdoor activities until the bell to start classes.
- 2. Bus students in grades K-9 are to eat their lunch at school. If there is a circumstance that necessitates your child leaving the school during lunch, a message/note must be given to the homeroom teacher by 9:00 a.m. No late message/text/phone call are accepted unless an unexpected situation arises or there is an emergency. Please contact the office. (442-2051)
- 3. All students with alternate departure plans must have their parent notify their homeroom teacher by 9:00 a.m. unless there is an unexpected situation or an emergency. If this is the case call the office at 442-2051.
